### LIVING UNDER THE UNIQUE HEADSHIP OF CHRIST AND IN THE UNIQUE DIVINE FELLOWSHIP

(Saturday—First Morning Session)

### Message Four **Holding the Head**

Scripture Reading: Col. 2:19; Eph. 4:15-16

- And <sup>1</sup>not <sup>a</sup>holding the Head, <sup>2b</sup>out from whom all the <sup>3</sup>Body, being richly supplied and knit together by Col 2:19 means of the <sup>4</sup>joints and <sup>5</sup>sinews, <sup>6</sup>grows with the <sup>7</sup>growth of God.
- Eph 4:15
- But <sup>1</sup>holding to truth in <sup>2a</sup>love, we may <sup>3b</sup>grow up into Him in all things, who is the <sup>4c</sup>Head, Christ, <sup>1</sup>Out from whom <sup>a</sup>all the Body, being <sup>2b</sup>joined together and being knit together through every <sup>3c</sup>joint of <sup>4</sup>the Eph 4:16 rich supply <sup>5</sup> and through the <sup>6</sup> operation in the <sup>d</sup> measure of <sup>7</sup> each one part, <sup>8</sup> causes the <sup>9</sup> growth of the Body unto the <sup>f</sup>building up of itself in <sup>10g</sup>love.

#### To hold the Head means that there is direct and intimate communication I. between us and Him; in this close communication between the Head and the members, all His riches are ministered into the members, and all the negative things are swallowed up by the supply of life from the Head—Col. 2:19:

- And <sup>1</sup>not <sup>a</sup>holding the Head, <sup>2b</sup>out from whom all the <sup>3</sup>Body, being richly supplied and knit together by means of the <sup>4</sup>joints and <sup>5</sup>sinews, <sup>6</sup>grows with the <sup>7</sup>growth of God.
- When we hold the Head, that is, keep ourselves intimately connected to Him, His riches and life supply enter into our being and become our growth in life.
- The phrase out from whom in Colossians 2:19 indicates that the Body of Christ grows out from the Head, for all the supply comes from the Head.
  - And <sup>1</sup>not <sup>a</sup>holding the Head, <sup>2b</sup>out from whom all the <sup>3</sup>Body, being richly supplied and knit together by means of the <sup>4</sup>joints and <sup>5</sup>sinews, <sup>6</sup>grows with the <sup>7</sup>growth of God.

#### II. To hold the Head is to acknowledge that only Christ is the Head and to come absolutely under His authority—1:18; 2 Cor. 2:12-15; 4:5-6:

- And He is the <sup>a</sup>Head of the <sup>b</sup>Body, the church; He is the <sup>c</sup>beginning, the <sup>1d</sup>Firstborn from the dead, that He Himself might have the first place in all things;
- 2 Cor 2:12 <sup>1</sup>Furthermore, when I came to <sup>a</sup>Troas for the gospel of Christ and a <sup>b</sup>door was open to me <sup>2</sup>in the Lord,
- 2 Cor 2:13 I had no rest in my <sup>1a</sup>spirit, for I did not find <sup>b</sup>Titus my brother; but taking leave of them, I went forth into <sup>2c</sup>Macedonia.
- 2 Cor 2:14 But athanks be to God, who always leads us in triumph in the Christ and manifests the savor of the <sup>d</sup>knowledge of Him through <sup>5</sup>us in every place.
- 2 Cor 2:15 For we <sup>1</sup> are a <sup>a</sup> fragrance of Christ to God in those who are being <sup>b</sup> saved and in those who are perishing:
- <sup>1</sup>For we do not <sup>a</sup>preach ourselves but Christ Jesus as <sup>2b</sup>Lord, and ourselves as your <sup>3c</sup>slaves for Jesus' sake. 2 Cor 4:5
- <sup>1</sup>Because the God who said, Out of <sup>a</sup>darkness <sup>b</sup>light shall shine, is the One who shined <sup>2</sup>in <sup>3</sup>our 2 Cor 4:6 chearts to 4dilluminate the knowledge of the eglory of God in the 5face of Jesus Christ.
- Only the Lord is our Head, and only He has the authority to direct the moves of the members of His Body; Christ is both the life and the authority of the Body; in fact, true authority is life.
- As the Head, the Lord is the One who decides our pathway; we do not have any ground В. for our own choice; the Body's only duty toward the Head is obedience and submission without any opinion, idea, or proposal.
- An acceptance of Christ as the Head involves a repudiation of all other heads; Christ alone is the Head of the Body, and no one else can be the head.
- D. Today we see many human methods and ordinances abounding in the church, but human plans and human decisions are against the headship of Christ.

- E. If Christ is my Head, then I will not dare to please myself or others; I must seek to please Him alone—5:9; 1 Thes. 2:4; Col. 1:10; cf. Acts 2:36; 9:5.
  - 2 Cor 5:9 Therefore also we are <sup>1</sup>determined, whether <sup>2</sup>at home or abroad, to gain the honor of being <sup>a</sup>well pleasing to Him.
  - 1 Thes 2:4 But even as we have been <sup>la</sup>approved by God to be <sup>b</sup>entrusted with the gospel, so we speak, not as <sup>c</sup>pleasing men but God, who <sup>d</sup>proves our hearts.
  - Col 1:10 To <sup>1</sup>walk worthily of the Lord to please *Him* <sup>2</sup>in all things, <sup>3</sup>bearing fruit in every good work and growing by the full <sup>4</sup>knowledge of God,
  - Acts 2:36 Therefore let all the house of Israel know assuredly that God has made Him both <sup>1a</sup>Lord and <sup>b</sup>Christ, this Jesus whom <sup>2</sup>you have <sup>c</sup>crucified.
  - Acts 9:5 And he said, Who are You, <sup>1</sup>Lord? And He said, I am Jesus, whom you persecute.
- F. Once a man realizes that he is a member in the Body, there will be a feeling of submission in him because submission is a law in the Body; in submission there is power—cf. Judg. 16:17.
  - Judg 16:17 And he told her all his heart and said to her, No razor has ever come upon my head, for I have been a Nazarite to God from my mother's womb. If I were shaved, my strength would leave me, and I would become weak and be like all men.

### III. Our relationship to the Head determines our relationship to the other members; the basis of our fellowship with one another is our mutual holding of the Head:

- A. If we hold the Head, we cannot have a special relationship, feeling, or fellowship with any individual or group of individuals; there is no room for our own preferences in the Body.
- B. We have no direct communication with one another; the mutual relationship of the members passes through the Head first:
  - 1. For instance, when my left hand hurts, my right hand comes to its aid immediately; the right hand does this because both the left hand and the right hand are under the direction of the head.
  - 2. Forming parties means that a few Christians have a direct relationship with one another and are detached from the authority of the Head; they communicate with each other directly, but their communication has not passed through the Head; they have a special relationship with one another, but their relationship has not passed through the Head; they have a special friendship among themselves that does not issue from their love for the Lord—1 Cor. 1:10-13; 11:19.
    - 1 Cor 1:10 Now I beseech you, brothers, through the <sup>1a</sup>name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you all <sup>2b</sup>speak the same thing and *that* there be no <sup>3c</sup>divisions among you, but *that* you be <sup>4</sup>attuned in the <sup>d</sup>same mind and in the same <sup>5e</sup>opinion.
    - 1 Cor 1:11 For it has been made clear to me concerning you, my brothers, by those of *the household of* <sup>1</sup>Chloe, that there are <sup>a</sup>strifes among you.
    - 1 Cor 1:12 Now <sup>1a</sup>I mean this, that each of you says, I am of <sup>b</sup>Paul, and I of <sup>c</sup>Apollos, and I of <sup>d</sup>Cephas, and I of <sup>2</sup>Christ.
    - 1 Cor 1:13 Is <sup>1</sup>Christ <sup>a</sup>divided? Was Paul <sup>2</sup>crucified for you? Or were you <sup>b</sup>baptized into the name of Paul?
    - 1 Cor 11:19 For there must even be <sup>1</sup>parties among you, that those who are <sup>2</sup>approved may become <sup>3</sup>manifest among you.
- C. If our fellowship is based on man, we are not holding the Head, and our fellowship is Absalom's fellowship, which drew the Israelites away from David—2 Sam. 15:2-6.
  - 2 Sam 15:2 And Absalom would rise up early and stand beside the way into the gate; and when any man who had a cause that should have come to the king for judgment came, Absalom would call to him and say, What city are you from? And he would say, Your servant is from one of the tribes of Israel.
  - 2 Sam 15:3 Then Absalom would say to him, See, your matters are good and right, but there is no one appointed by the king to hear you.

- 2 Sam 15:4 And Absalom would say, Oh that I were made a judge in the land, that every man who had a cause or a matter to be judged would come to me, and I would do him justice!
- 2 Sam 15:5 And so when any man came near to pay him homage, he would put forth his hand and take hold of him and kiss him.
- 2 Sam 15:6 And Absalom acted in this way to all the Israelites who came to the king for judgment. And Absalom stole the hearts of the men of Israel.
- D. In order to hold the Head, we must allow the cross to deeply deal with our flesh and our natural life, on the one hand, and we must learn to walk by the Spirit, on the other hand—Gal. 5:16, 24-25; cf. Rev. 14:4.
  - Gal 5:16 But I say, <sup>1a</sup>Walk <sup>b</sup>by the <sup>2</sup>Spirit and you shall by no means <sup>c</sup>fulfill the <sup>d</sup>lust of the flesh.
  - Gal 5:24 But they who are <sup>a</sup>of Christ Jesus <sup>2</sup>have <sup>3b</sup>crucified the <sup>c</sup>flesh with its passions and its lusts.
  - Gal 5:25 If we <sup>1</sup>live by the Spirit, let us also <sup>2a</sup>walk by the Spirit.
  - Rev 14:4 These are they who have not been defiled with women, for they are <sup>1a</sup>virgins. These are they who <sup>b</sup>follow the Lamb wherever He may go. These were purchased from among men *as* <sup>2c</sup> firstfruits to God and to the Lamb.

# IV. If we hold the Head, we cannot have different interpretations of Scripture; differences arise when someone is not holding the Head, because He cannot possibly say one thing to one member and something else to another:

- A. We have to consider "one mouth" in Romans 15:6 and "speak the same thing" in 1 Corinthians 1:10 together with "one new man" in Ephesians 2:15.
  - Rom 15:6 That <sup>1</sup>with <sup>a</sup>one accord you may with <sup>b</sup>one mouth <sup>c</sup>glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.
  - 1 Cor 1:10 Now I beseech you, brothers, through the <sup>1a</sup>name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you all <sup>2b</sup>speak the same thing and *that* there be no <sup>3c</sup>divisions among you, but *that* you be <sup>4</sup>attuned in the <sup>d</sup>same mind and in the same <sup>5e</sup>opinion.
  - Eph 2:15 <sup>1a</sup>Abolishing in His <sup>2</sup>flesh the <sup>3</sup>law of the commandments in <sup>4</sup>ordinances, that He might <sup>5</sup>create the two <sup>6</sup>in Himself <sup>7</sup>into <sup>8</sup>one <sup>b</sup>new man, *so* <sup>9</sup>c making peace,
- B. The Head of the Body as the one new man is the person of the Body, and this person has one mouth to speak the same thing; when we hold Christ as the Head, we are all taking Him as our unique person, so we all have one mouth and are in one accord to speak the same thing—the unique teaching of God's eternal economy regarding Christ and the church—1 Tim. 1:3-4; Eph. 5:32.
  - 1 Tim 1:3 Even as I exhorted you, when I was <sup>1</sup>going into <sup>a</sup>Macedonia, to remain in <sup>b</sup>Ephesus in order that you might charge <sup>2</sup>certain ones not to teach <sup>3c</sup>different things
  - 1 Tim 1:4 Nor to give heed to <sup>1a</sup>myths and unending <sup>2b</sup>genealogies, which produce <sup>c</sup>questionings rather than God's <sup>3d</sup>economy, which is in <sup>4e</sup>faith.
  - Eph 5:32 This amystery is great, but I speak with regard to Christ and the church.

# V. The very Christ who is the reality of all positive things is the One who is the Head of the Body; thus, to hold the Head is simply to enjoy Christ as the reality of all positive things—Col. 1:18; 2:16-17, 19:

- Col 1:18 And He is the <sup>a</sup>Head of the <sup>b</sup>Body, the church; He is the <sup>c</sup>beginning, the <sup>1d</sup>Firstborn from the dead, that He Himself might have the first place in all things;
- Col 2:16 Let no one therefore judge you <sup>1</sup>in <sup>a</sup>eating and in drinking or in respect of a <sup>2b</sup>feast or of a <sup>3c</sup>new moon or of the <sup>4d</sup>Sabbath,
- Col 2:17 Which are a <sup>1a</sup>shadow of the things to come, but the <sup>2</sup>body is of <sup>3b</sup>Christ.
- Col 2:19 And <sup>1</sup>not <sup>a</sup>holding the Head, <sup>2b</sup>out from whom all the <sup>3</sup>Body, being richly supplied and knit together by means of the <sup>4</sup>joints and <sup>5</sup>sinews, <sup>6</sup>grows with the <sup>7</sup>growth of God.
- A. Since the Christ whom we enjoy as our everything is the Head of the Body, the more we enjoy Him, the more we become Body-conscious:
  - 1. This indicates that the enjoyment of Christ is not an individualistic matter but a Body matter—cf. Eph. 3:8; 4:15-16.
    - Eph 3:8 To me, <sup>1</sup>less than the <sup>a</sup>least of all saints, was this <sup>b</sup>grace given to announce to the <sup>c</sup>Gentiles the <sup>2</sup>unsearchable <sup>3d</sup>riches of Christ as the gospel

- Eph 4:15 But <sup>1</sup>holding to truth in <sup>2a</sup>love, we may <sup>3b</sup>grow up into Him in all things, who is the <sup>4c</sup>Head. Christ.
- Eph 4:16 Out from whom <sup>a</sup>all the Body, being <sup>2b</sup>joined together and being knit together through every <sup>3c</sup>joint of <sup>4</sup>the rich supply <sup>5</sup>and *through* the <sup>6</sup>operation in the <sup>d</sup>measure of <sup>7</sup>each one part, <sup>8</sup>causes the <sup>9e</sup>growth of the Body unto the <sup>f</sup>building up of itself in <sup>10g</sup>love.
- 2. The more we enjoy Christ, the more we love the other members of the Body—Col. 1:4, 8.
  - Col 1:4 Because we have heard of your <sup>1a</sup>faith in Christ Jesus and the <sup>b</sup>love which you have unto all the saints
  - Col 1:8 Who also has made known to us your alove in the Spirit.
- B. Because Christ's headship is in resurrection (v. 18), the enjoyment of Christ spontaneously brings us into resurrection and saves us from our natural being.
  - Col 1:18 And He is the <sup>a</sup>Head of the <sup>b</sup>Body, the church; He is the <sup>c</sup>beginning, the <sup>1d</sup>Firstborn from the dead, that He Himself might have the first place in all things;
- C. The enjoyment of Christ brings us into the heavenlies in ascension; we can be experientially in the heavens only by enjoying Christ, the Head, as the lifegiving Spirit in our spirit—3:1-2; 2 Cor. 3:17; 2 Tim. 4:22; Rom. 8:10, 34.
  - Col 3:1 If therefore you were <sup>2a</sup>raised together with Christ, seek the things which are <sup>3</sup>above, where Christ is, sitting at the <sup>b</sup>right hand of God.
  - Col 3:2 Set your amind on the things which are above, not on the things which are on the earth.
  - 2 Cor 3:17 <sup>1</sup>And the <sup>2</sup>Lord is the <sup>3a</sup>Spirit; and where the <sup>4b</sup>Spirit of the Lord is, there is <sup>5c</sup>freedom.
  - 2 Tim 4:22 The Lord be with your <sup>1a</sup> spirit. <sup>2b</sup>Grace be with you.
  - Rom 8:10 But if <sup>1a</sup>Christ is <sup>2</sup>in you, though the <sup>3</sup>body is <sup>4</sup>dead because of sin, the <sup>5</sup>spirit is <sup>6</sup>life because of <sup>7</sup>righteousness.
  - Rom 8:34 Who is he who condemns? <sup>1</sup>It is Christ Jesus who <sup>a</sup>died and, rather, who <sup>b</sup>was raised, who is also <sup>2c</sup>at the right hand of God, who also <sup>3d</sup>intercedes for us.
- D. As we enjoy Christ and hold Him as the Head, we absorb the riches of the extensive, all-inclusive Christ; these riches become in us the increase of God by which the Body grows for its building up—Col. 2:19, 6-8; Eph. 4:16.
  - Col 2:19 And <sup>1</sup>not <sup>a</sup>holding the Head, <sup>2b</sup>out from whom all the <sup>3</sup>Body, being richly supplied and knit together by means of the <sup>4</sup>joints and <sup>5</sup>sinews, <sup>6</sup>grows with the <sup>7</sup>growth of God.
  - Col 2:6 As therefore you have <sup>1a</sup> received the Christ, Jesus the Lord, <sup>2b</sup> walk in Him,
  - Col 2:7 Having been <sup>1a</sup>rooted and being <sup>b</sup>built up <sup>2</sup>in Him, and being established in the faith even as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving.
  - Col 2:8 Beware that no one carries you off as spoil through his <sup>1</sup>philosophy and <sup>a</sup>empty deceit, according to the <sup>2b</sup>tradition of men, according to the <sup>3c</sup>elements of the world, and not according to <sup>4d</sup>Christ;
  - Eph 4:16 Out from whom all the Body, being 2b joined together and being knit together through every 3c joint of 4the rich supply 5 and *through* the 6 operation in the 4 measure of 7 each one part, 8 causes the 9 growth of the Body unto the 6 building up of itself in 10 glove.

### VI. In Colossians 2 Paul speaks of being rooted and of holding the Head, and in John 15 the Lord Jesus speaks of abiding in the vine:

- Col 2:1 For I want you to know how great a \*struggle I have for you and *for* those in \*Laodicea, even all who have not seen my face in the flesh,
- Col 2:2 That their hearts may be <sup>1a</sup>comforted, they being knit together in <sup>2</sup>love and unto all the <sup>3</sup>riches of the <sup>4b</sup>full assurance of understanding, unto the full knowledge of the <sup>5c</sup>mystery of God, Christ,
- Col 2:3 In whom all the treasures of <sup>1a</sup>wisdom and knowledge are hidden.
- Col 2:4 This I say that no one may <sup>1</sup>delude you with <sup>2a</sup>persuasive speech.
- Col 2:5 For even though I am absent in the flesh, yet in the <sup>1a</sup>spirit I am with you, rejoicing and seeing your order and the solid basis of your faith <sup>2</sup>in Christ.
- Col 2:6 As therefore you have <sup>1a</sup>received the Christ, Jesus the Lord, <sup>2b</sup>walk in Him,
- Col 2:7 Having been <sup>1a</sup>rooted and being <sup>b</sup>built up <sup>2</sup>in Him, and being established in the faith even as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving.
- Col 2:8 Beware that no one carries you off as spoil through his <sup>1</sup>philosophy and <sup>a</sup>empty deceit, according to the <sup>2b</sup>tradition of men, according to the <sup>3c</sup>elements of the world, and not according to <sup>4d</sup>Christ;

- Col 2:9 For in Him dwells all the <sup>1a</sup>fullness of the <sup>2</sup>Godhead <sup>3</sup>bodily,
- Col 2:10 And you have been made <sup>1</sup>full in Him, who is the <sup>a</sup>Head of all <sup>2</sup>rule and authority.
- Col 2:11 In Him also you were <sup>a</sup>circumcised with a <sup>1</sup>circumcision <sup>2</sup>not <sup>b</sup>made with hands, in the <sup>3</sup>putting off of the body of the flesh, in the circumcision of Christ,
- Col 2:12 <sup>1a</sup>Buried together with Him in baptism, in which also you were <sup>2b</sup>raised together with *Him* through the <sup>3</sup>faith of the operation of God, who <sup>c</sup>raised Him from the dead.
- Col 2:13 And you, though <sup>1a</sup>dead in your offenses and in the uncircumcision of your flesh, He <sup>2b</sup>made alive together with Him, having forgiven us all our offenses;
- Col 2:14 <sup>1a</sup>Wiping out the <sup>2</sup>handwriting in <sup>3</sup>ordinances, which was against us, which was contrary to us; and He has taken it out of the way, <sup>4</sup>nailing it to the cross.
- Col 2:15 <sup>1</sup>Stripping off the <sup>2a</sup>rulers and the authorities, <sup>3</sup>He made a <sup>4</sup>display *of them* openly, triumphing over them in <sup>5</sup>it.
- Col 2:16 Let no one therefore judge you <sup>1</sup>in <sup>a</sup>eating and in drinking or in respect of a <sup>2b</sup>feast or of a <sup>3c</sup>new moon or of the <sup>4d</sup>Sabbath,
- Col 2:17 Which are a <sup>1a</sup>shadow of the things to come, but the <sup>2</sup>body is of <sup>3b</sup>Christ.
- Col 2:18 Let no one <sup>1</sup>defraud you by judging you unworthy of your <sup>a</sup>prize, in <sup>b</sup>self-chosen <sup>2</sup>lowliness and the worship of the angels, <sup>3</sup>dwelling on the things which he has <sup>4</sup>seen, vainly <sup>c</sup>puffed up by <sup>5</sup>his mind set on the flesh,
- Col 2:19 And <sup>1</sup>not <sup>a</sup>holding the Head, <sup>2b</sup>out from whom all the <sup>3</sup>Body, being richly supplied and knit together by means of the <sup>4</sup>joints and <sup>5</sup>sinews, <sup>6</sup>grows with the <sup>7</sup>growth of God.
- Col 2:20 <sup>1</sup>If you <sup>2a</sup>died with Christ from the <sup>3b</sup>elements of the world, why, as living in the world, do you subject yourselves to <sup>c</sup>ordinances:
- Col 2:21 Do not handle, nor taste, nor touch,
- Col 2:22 (*Regarding* things which are all to <sup>1a</sup>perish when <sup>2</sup>used) according to the <sup>b</sup>commandments and teachings of men?
- Col 2:23 <sup>1</sup>Such things indeed have a <sup>2</sup>reputation of wisdom in self-imposed <sup>a</sup>worship and lowliness and <sup>3b</sup>severe treatment of the body, *but* are <sup>4</sup>not of any value against the <sup>c</sup>indulgence of the flesh.
- John 15:1 I am the <sup>1</sup>true <sup>a</sup>vine, and My Father is the <sup>2</sup>husbandman.
- John 15:2 Every branch in Me that does not bear fruit, He takes it away; and every *branch* that bears fruit, He <sup>1</sup>prunes it that it may bear more fruit.
- John 15:3 You are already <sup>a</sup>clean because of the word which I have spoken to you.
- John 15:4 <sup>a</sup>Abide <sup>b</sup>in Me and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit <sup>1</sup>of itself unless it abides in the vine, so neither *can* you unless you abide in Me.
- John 15:5 I am the vine; you are the branches. He who abides in Me and I in him, he bears amuch fruit; for apart from Me you can do nothing.
- John 15:6 If one does not abide in Me, he is <sup>1a</sup>cast out as a branch and is dried up; and they gather them and cast *them* into the <sup>b</sup>fire, and they are <sup>c</sup>burned.
- John 15:7 If you abide in Me and My <sup>1a</sup>words abide in you, <sup>2</sup>ask whatever you will, and it shall be done for you.
- John 15:8 In this is My Father <sup>1a</sup>glorified, that you bear much fruit and *so* you will become My <sup>b</sup>disciples.
- John 15:9 As the Father has aloved Me, I also have loved you; abide in My love.
- John 15:10 If you <sup>1</sup>keep My <sup>a</sup>commandments, you will abide in My love; even as I have kept My Father's commandments and abide in His love.
- John 15:11 These things I have spoken to you that My <sup>1a</sup>joy may be in you and *that* your joy may be made full.
- John 15:12 This is My <sup>a</sup>commandment, that you <sup>b</sup>love one another even as I have loved you.
- John 15:13 No one has greater love than this, that one <sup>a</sup>lay down his <sup>1</sup>life for his friends.
- John 15:14 You are My <sup>a</sup>friends if you do what I command you.
- John 15:15 No longer do I call you slaves, for the slave does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all the things which I have heard from My Father I have made known to you.
- John 15:16 You did not choose Me, but I achose you, and I set you that you should go forth and bear fruit and that your fruit should remain, that whatever you scass the Father in My name, He may give you.
- John 15:17 These things I command you that you may <sup>1a</sup>love one another.
- John 15:18 If the world <sup>a</sup>hates you, know that it has <sup>b</sup>hated Me before you.
- John 15:19 If you were <sup>1</sup> of the world, the world would love its own; but because you are <sup>a</sup>not of the world, but I chose you out of the world, therefore the world hates you.
- John 15:20 Remember the word which I said to you, A slave is not <sup>a</sup>greater than his master. If they have been persecuted Me, they will <sup>c</sup>persecute you also; if they have kept My word, they will keep yours also.
- John 15:21 But all these things they will do to you because of My aname, because they do not know Him who sent Me.

- John 15:22 If I had not come and spoken to them, they would not have asin; but now they have no excuse for their sin.
- John 15:23 He who hates Me hates My Father also.
- John 15:24 If I did not do among them the aworks which no one else has done, they would not have sin; but now they have both seen and hated both Me and My Father.
- John 15:25 But it is so that the word written in their law may be fulfilled, "aThey hated Me without cause."
- John 15:26 But when the <sup>a</sup>Comforter comes, whom I will <sup>b</sup>send to you <sup>1c</sup> from the Father, the <sup>d</sup>Spirit of reality, who proceeds from the Father, He will etestify concerning Me;
- John 15:27 And <sup>a</sup>you testify also, because from the beginning you have been with Me.
- Abiding in the vine is equal to being rooted in the soil, and being rooted in the soil is equal to holding the Head; Christ is the vine in which we abide, the soil in which we are rooted, and the Head whom we hold.
- As branches, we absorb the life-juice from the vine; as plants, we absorb the riches of the soil; and as members of the Body of Christ, we absorb the nourishing element from the Head; by absorbing the riches of the Head, the Body grows with the growth of God, with the increase of God as life within us.
- Since God gives the growth in this way, we need to take time to absorb Him:
  - Our contact with the Lord should not be rushed; every morning we need to take an adequate amount of time to absorb the Lord; it is best to spend thirty minutes to enjoy Him at the start of each new day.
  - 2. We need to forget our situation, our condition, our failures, and our weaknesses and simply take time to enjoy and absorb the Lord; we need to spend more time in our spirit to adore the Lord, to praise Him, to offer thanks to Him, and to speak to Him freely.
  - As we fellowship with Him in this way, we will absorb His riches, and He will add 3. more of Himself into us so that we may grow with the growth of God.

#### VII. We grow up into the Head by allowing Christ to increase and to grow in all the inward parts of our being—Eph. 4:15-16:

- Eph 4:15
- But ¹holding to truth in ²alove, we may ³bgrow up into Him in all things, who is the ⁴cHead, Christ, ¹Out from whom all the Body, being ²bjoined together and being knit together through every ³cjoint of ⁴the rich supply ⁵and *through* the °operation in the ⁴measure of ²each one part, 8causes the Eph 4:16 <sup>9e</sup>growth of the Body unto the <sup>f</sup>building up of itself in <sup>10g</sup>love.
- In order to grow in life, we must know, we must use, and we must exercise our mingled spirit—1 Tim. 4:7; 2 Tim. 1:6-7; 4:22.
  - 1 Tim 4:7 But the <sup>1a</sup>profane and old-womanish <sup>2b</sup>myths <sup>3</sup>refuse, and <sup>4</sup>exercise yourself unto <sup>c</sup>godliness.
  - 2 Tim 1:6 For which cause I remind you to <sup>1</sup> fan into flame the <sup>a</sup>gift of God, which is in you through the <sup>2b</sup>laying on of my hands.
  - 2 Tim 1:7 For God has not given us a <sup>1a</sup>spirit <sup>2</sup>of <sup>b</sup>cowardice, but of <sup>c</sup>power and of <sup>d</sup>love and of <sup>e</sup>sobermindedness.
  - 2 Tim 4:22 The Lord be with your <sup>1a</sup>spirit. <sup>2b</sup>Grace be with you.
- In order to grow in life, we must feed on the milk and food of the holy Word as the embodiment of Christ, the living Word of God—1 Pet. 2:2; Heb. 5:13-14.
  - As <sup>1</sup>newborn <sup>a</sup>babes, long for the <sup>2</sup>guileless <sup>b</sup>milk <sup>3</sup>of the word in order that by it you may <sup>c</sup>grow <sup>5</sup>unto <sup>d</sup>salvation,
  - For everyone who partakes of <sup>1</sup>milk is inexperienced in the <sup>a</sup>word of righteousness, for he is Heb 5:13 an binfant;
  - Heb 5:14 But solid food is for the afull-grown, who because of practice have their faculties exercised for discriminating between both <sup>2</sup>good and evil.

### VIII. As we grow up into the Head in life, our function will come out from the Head for the building up of the Body—Eph. 4:16:

Out from whom all the Body, being bijoined together and being knit together through every cipint of the rich supply and through the operation in the measure of each one part, causes the <sup>9e</sup>growth of the Body unto the <sup>f</sup>building up of itself in <sup>10g</sup>love.

- A. When we allow Christ to be the Head in everything and when we grow up into Him in all things, we will be supplied with the riches of His life, receiving something from Him to transfuse into other members of the Body—2 Cor. 3:6, 8; John 7:37-39.
  - 2 Cor 3:6 Who has also made us <sup>a</sup>sufficient as <sup>b</sup>ministers of a <sup>c</sup>new covenant, *ministers* not of the <sup>1</sup>letter but of the <sup>2d</sup>Spirit; for the <sup>3</sup>letter kills, but the <sup>4e</sup>Spirit gives life.
  - 2 Cor 3:8 How shall the <sup>1a</sup>ministry of the <sup>b</sup>Spirit not be more in <sup>2</sup>glory?
  - John 7:37 Now on the <sup>1</sup>last day, the great *day* of the feast, Jesus stood and cried out, saying, If anyone <sup>a</sup>thirsts, let him <sup>b</sup>come to Me and <sup>c</sup>drink.
  - John 7:38 He who believes into Me, as the Scripture said, out of his ainnermost being shall 1 flow 2 rivers of living water.
  - John 7:39 But this He said concerning the <sup>1a</sup>Spirit, whom those who believed into Him were about to receive; for *the* Spirit was not yet, because Jesus had not yet been <sup>b</sup>glorified.
- B. All the Body causes the growth of the Body of Christ—Eph. 4:16:
  - Eph 4:16 Out from whom all the Body, being bjoined together and being knit together through every significant of the rich supply and through the operation in the measure of each one part, scauses the growth of the Body unto the building up of itself in loglove.
  - 1. This growth is through every joint of the rich supply—all the particular gifts in the Body of Christ—vv. 11-12.
    - Eph 4:11 And He Himself gave <sup>1</sup>some as <sup>a</sup>apostles and some as <sup>b</sup>prophets and some as <sup>c</sup>evangelists and some as <sup>2</sup>shepherds and <sup>d</sup>teachers,
    - Eph 4:12 For the <sup>1a</sup>perfecting of the saints <sup>2</sup>unto the work of the <sup>3b</sup>ministry, unto the <sup>4c</sup>building up of the <sup>d</sup>Body of Christ,
  - 2. This growth is through the operation in the measure of each one part—every member in the Body of Christ—vv. 7-8.
    - Eph 4:7 But to each one of us <sup>2a</sup>grace was given according to the <sup>3b</sup>measure of the <sup>c</sup>gift of Christ.
    - Eph 4:8 Therefore *the Scripture* says, "Having <sup>a</sup>ascended to the <sup>1</sup>height, He led captive <sup>2</sup>those taken captive and gave <sup>3b</sup>gifts to men."
- C. The building up of the Body of Christ is in love and by love—1 Cor. 8:1b:
  - 1 Cor 8:1b ... <sup>4</sup>Knowledge <sup>c</sup>puffs up, but <sup>d</sup>love <sup>5e</sup>builds up.
  - 1. Love is the most excellent way to be anything and to do anything for the building up of the Body of Christ—12:31b—13:13.
    - 1 Cor 12:31b ... And moreover I show to you a <sup>3</sup>most excellent way.
    - 1 Cor 13:1 If I speak in the atongues of men and of angels but do not have blove, I have become sounding brass or a clanging cymbal.
    - 1 Cor 13:2 And if I have *the gift of* <sup>a</sup>prophecy and know all <sup>b</sup>mysteries and all <sup>c</sup>knowledge, and if I have all <sup>d</sup>faith so as to <sup>e</sup>remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing.
    - 1 Cor 13:3 And if I <sup>a</sup>dole out all my possessions to feed *others*, and if I <sup>1</sup>deliver up my <sup>b</sup>body <sup>2</sup>that I may boast, but do not have love, I profit nothing.
    - 1 Cor 13:4 Love bsuffers long. Love is kind; it is not eputfed up:
    - 1 Cor 13:5 It does not behave unbecomingly *and* does not <sup>a</sup>seek its own things; it is not provoked *and* does not take account of evil;
    - 1 Cor 13:6 It does anot rejoice because of unrighteousness, but rejoices with the truth;
    - 1 Cor 13:7 It <sup>1a</sup>covers all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.
    - 1 Cor 13:8 Love <sup>1</sup>never falls *away*. But whether <sup>b</sup>prophecies, they will be rendered useless; or <sup>c</sup>tongues, they will cease; or <sup>d</sup>knowledge, it will be rendered useless.
    - 1 Cor 13:9 For we aknow in part, and we prophesy in part;
    - 1 Cor 13:10 But <sup>1</sup>when that which is <sup>2</sup>complete comes, <sup>3</sup>that which is in part will be rendered useless.
    - 1 Cor 13:11 When I was a <sup>2a</sup>child, I spoke as a child, I thought as a <sup>b</sup>child, I <sup>3</sup>reasoned as a child; <sup>4</sup>since I have become a man, I have done away with childish things.
    - 1 Cor 13:12 For <sup>1</sup>now we see <sup>2</sup>in a <sup>a</sup>mirror <sup>3</sup>obscurely, but at <sup>4</sup>that time <sup>b</sup>face to face; now I <sup>c</sup>know in part, but at that time I will fully <sup>d</sup>know even as also I was fully known.
    - 1 Cor 13:13 Now there abide <sup>la</sup>faith, <sup>b</sup>hope, <sup>c</sup>love, these three; and the greatest of these is <sup>d</sup>love.

- 2. The goal of the book of Ephesians is to bring us into love as God's inner substance (1 John 4:8, 16) so that we may enjoy God as love and enjoy His presence in the sweetness of the divine love, and thereby we may love others as Christ did—Eph. 5:25; 6:24; 1:4; 3:17; 4:2, 15-16; 5:2.
  - 1 John 4:8 He who adoes not love has not known God, because God is clove.
  - 1 John 4:16 And we know and have <sup>a</sup>believed the <sup>1</sup>love which God has <sup>2</sup>in us. God is <sup>3</sup>love, and he who <sup>4</sup>abides in love <sup>5</sup>abides in God and <sup>6</sup>God abides in him.
  - Eph 5:25 Husbands, <sup>1a</sup>love your wives even <sup>2</sup>as Christ also <sup>b</sup>loved the church and gave Himself up for her
  - Eph 6:24 laGrace be with all those who 2blove our Lord Jesus Christ in 3cincorruptibility.
  - Eph 1:4 Even as He <sup>1a</sup>chose us in Him <sup>2b</sup>before the foundation of the world to be <sup>5c</sup>holy and <sup>4</sup>without blemish <sup>5</sup>before Him <sup>6</sup>in <sup>7d</sup>love,
  - Eph 3:17 That Christ may make His <sup>a</sup>home in your <sup>1</sup>hearts through <sup>2</sup>faith, that you, being <sup>3b</sup>rooted and grounded in <sup>4c</sup>love,
  - Eph 4:2 With all <sup>la</sup>lowliness and <sup>b</sup>meekness, with <sup>c</sup>long-suffering, bearing one another in <sup>d</sup>love,
  - Eph 4:15 But <sup>1</sup>holding to truth in <sup>2a</sup>love, we may <sup>3b</sup>grow up into Him in all things, who is the <sup>4c</sup>Head, Christ,
  - Eph 4:16 Out from whom all the Body, being 2bjoined together and being knit together through every 3cjoint of 4the rich supply 5and *through* the 6operation in the 4measure of 7each one part, 8causes the 9egrowth of the Body unto the building up of itself in 10glove.
  - Eph 5:2 And <sup>a</sup>walk in <sup>1b</sup>love, even as <sup>2</sup>Christ also <sup>c</sup>loved <sup>3</sup>us and gave Himself up for us, an <sup>4</sup>offering and a <sup>d</sup>sacrifice to God for a <sup>5e</sup>sweet-smelling savor.
